Election of Commissioner - Deana nominated Brian Livesey as Commissioner; all approved. #### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### Chamber of Commerce

- Linda reported that the Chamber's renewal rate was around 70% with an average of 2 new members joining per month. One of the new members is in Matawan, Ivy Rehab, located in The Edge next to Justin's Barbershop and would like a weekday ribbon cutting. Linda will check with Mayor on his availability. Justin's Barbershop never had a ribbon cutting and would also like one perhaps on a weekend.
- The Chamber will be holding a virtual event on Tuesday, Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> on cybersecurity and an interactive paint zoom at the end of the month. The "netwalking" event went well in Cheesequake Park and will continue once or twice a month as weather permits.
- Matawan Day potentially Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup> with Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup> as raindate. Cathy suggested we expand from Highway 34 all the way down Main St in order to properly social distance. The coordinator from Matawan's Relay for Life is looking for food trucks from Matawan & Aberdeen. He knows about Esposito's. Cathy suggested Ralph's and Papa Ganache.

## Take Out Week

• Cathy reported that it was well accepted by restaurants even though many did not get much business. They all want to be included in the next one, probably in Spring before lakeside dining begins. She felt it needed more advertising and would do a banner on Main St.

#### Businesses in Town

• Brian and Jay visited businesses in town and took photos for website. One of the new businesses on Little St. – Youphoria – is interested in painting murals on the buildings or sidewalks. There is no ordinance against it, but it could only be done with the permission of

- the landlords and approvals should go through the Borough Administrator. They are looking for "Public Art" volunteers. (Cathy could do & Maria from Young at Art) Cathy suggested that they could hang slabs of wood to paint the murals on which could then be removed.
- Brian reported that the realtor spreadsheet needed to be redone because of a computer crash. As soon as he gets it done, he will pass it on to Jen. Cathy said that she has not been able to get the information on "Steps to Open a Business" for Dean to prepare the flowchart because of the overwhelming steps involved and needs to do more research.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Flea Market/Farmers Market on Little Street

- Flea Market Brian introduced idea for one Saturday a month starting in late summer, run as a fundraiser by organization in town, maybe the First Aid Squad. A portion of Little Street could be used as well as part of the Sprague parking lot. Objections to parking lot Victoria's is being looked at by renters but they are having permit issues so opening could be delayed. Deana will check on whether police presence would be needed. Jay mentioned that there were companies that would bring in good vendors to avoid a junk flea market.
- Farmers Market Deana said it could take 16 months of work to get it going because of all the permits, etc. Jay to check out market at Bell Works when it opens. Cathy said there was one woman who runs all the Bell Works events, could ours be an extension of theirs?

## Virtual Business Meeting

• When? Virtual or In-person? Try for a Spring in-person meeting at lakeside before lakeside dining begins. Offer refreshments. Invite businesses to our meeting to introduce the commission, listen to their suggestions and interact.

## Lakeside Dining

• To start end of May and include the Library who will provide musicians similar to last year.

# Matawan Junction – New Development

• Brian showed presentation from the Council Meeting. It will include 103 apartments, plenty of parking, retail space of at least 10,000 sq ft. It should take 18 months to completion; awaiting agreement w/attorneys (60 days). The Council has confidence in the project and objections will be swayed with ratability arguments and the walkability factor.

• Rec Dept will be requesting assistance from Commission putting together its Easter Scavenger Hunt. No indoors; clues to be obtained outside of business.
